The pedestrian rail underpass at Santa Fe is the first of four planned safety crossings in the City of Encinitas and is designed to improve pedestrian safety and coastal access along this busy rail corridor. The City partnered with the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG), North County Transit District (NCTD) and Caltrans in the planning and funding of the \$6 million project.

During the next five years, SANDAG plans to construct an estimated \$450 million in improvements in the San Diego County section of the LOSSAN (Los Angeles - San Diego - San Luis Obispo) corridor, with a primary goal of double tracking the rail line from Orange County to downtown San Diego. To date, approximately half of the corridor has been double tracked. Other infrastructure improvements include bridge and track replacements, new platforms, safety and operational enhancements, and pedestrian undercrossings. As a companion to the I-5 freeway, the San Diego segment of the LOSSAN corridor plays a critical role in the movement of people and goods within the region's North Coast Corridor.
