

I-805/LA JOLLA VILLAGE DRIVE INTERCHANGE IMPROVEMENTS

FACT SHEET

The Project

This project will reconfigure the interchange at Interstate 805 (I-805)/ La Jolla Village Drive from a full cloverleaf to a partial cloverleaf design, and will include bridge widening and ramp realignments.

The Need

These improvements would eliminate the existing weave at the on- and off-ramps on I-805. By realigning the existing on- and off-ramps at La Jolla Village Drive, the project would improve safety for pedestrians and bicyclists and greatly enhance vehicular movements through the interchange area. The project would benefit residents, businesses, and commuters in this mixed use area.

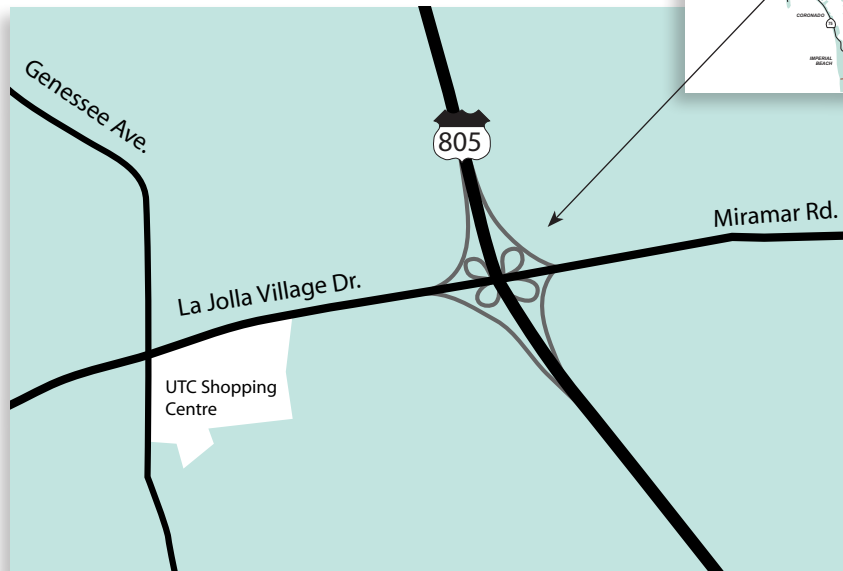
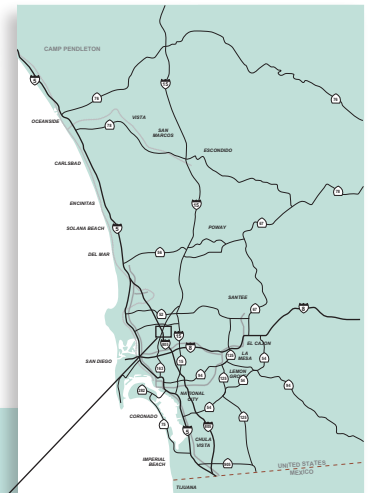
Project Status

An Environmental Impact Statement/ Environmental Impact Report was approved in October 1995 with this project being the final phase. Construction of the I-805/Nobel Drive Interchange was completed and opened

to the public in 2002. It was followed by the completion of the Miramar Road widening project in 2006. An environmental reevaluation for this final phase was needed to address changes in design standards and was approved in December 2006.

Funding Status

The project is now 100 percent designed, and 95 percent of funds have been secured. The FY 2009 Appropriation request for \$2 million will fully fund this project.



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
