Crews Make Progress on Centerline Stations

The SR 15 Mid-City Centerline Rapid Transit Stations are taking shape. Crews have finished pouring concrete columns in the SR 15 median at both University Avenue and El Cajon Boulevard, and have begun pouring the foundations for the elevators. Elevators will transport passengers between the freeway-level transit stations and the street level. Additionally, crews have been working to form transit station walls south of University Avenue.

As the safety of motorists and workers is the highest priority, the majority of construction work takes place at night to minimize traffic impacts. Night work also allows construction vehicles to move safely in and out of construction zones. Crews will work to minimize noise and light impacts to the surrounding neighborhoods. Thank you for your patience during construction.

Mid-City Fun Fact Did You Know...

Teralta Park is the only park above a freeway in all of San Diego County. Built over SR 15 in 2002, this unique four-acre park provides a much-needed gathering space for residents in City Heights and surrounding communities.

Over the years, Teralta Park has provided a venue for everything from birthday parties and fitness activities to movie nights and events to help at-risk youth. Community members have worked together to request improvements, such as enhanced lighting, decorative signage, and new landscaping, to make the park an attractive and vibrant place for everyone to enjoy.

Project Summary

The \$65 million project will build San Diego's first freeway-level Rapid transit stations along SR 15 at El Cajon Boulevard and University Avenue. New 2.5-mile transit-only lanes also will be constructed within the existing SR 15 median from just north of Interstate 805 to just south of Interstate 8. The SR 15 Mid-City Centerline Rapid Transit Stations Project is expected to be completed in 2017.
