


Overnight Construction and Closures Scheduled on El Cajon Boulevard at SR 15 February 24-27

Crews will install upgraded sidewalks along El Cajon Boulevard at State Route 15 (SR 15) from 9 p.m. Friday, February 24, to 5 a.m. Monday, February 27. Intermittent sidewalk closures along El Cajon Boulevard and University Avenue will occur over the next four weekends.

February 24 – 27 (Friday night to Monday morning)

- Southbound SR 15 El Cajon Boulevard on-ramp and northbound SR 15 El Cajon Boulevard off-ramp closed.
- Sidewalk closed on eastbound side of El Cajon Boulevard between 37th Street and Marlborough Avenue. Pedestrians will be detoured to north side of El Cajon Boulevard via 37th Street and Marlborough Avenue. At least one vehicle lane in each direction will remain open along El Cajon Boulevard.



Bus stops closed on the northbound and southbound SR 15 El Cajon Boulevard off-ramps and on the
eastbound side of the El Cajon Boulevard bridge between Central Avenue and 40th Street. Please visit

Nearby residents can expect intermittent lights and noise during nighttime construction. Crews will work to minimize impacts to nearby businesses, residents, and commuters.

As the safety of motorists and workers is the highest priority, the majority of construction work takes place at night to minimize traffic impacts. Night work also allows construction vehicles to move safely in and out of construction zones. Your patience during construction is appreciated.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The \$65 million project will build San Diego's first freeway-level transit stations along SR 15 at El Cajon Boulevard and University Avenue. New 2.5-mile transit-only lanes also will be constructed within the existing SR 15 median from just north of Interstate 805 to just south of Interstate 8. The SR 15 Mid-City Centerline *Rapid* Transit Stations Project is expected to be completed in summer 2017.

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
