

Rapid Transit Stations Update



Great progress has been made on the deck of the pedestrian bridge in the SR 15 median south of University Avenue.

Construction crews are currently working on preparing the deck of the pedestrian bridge in the State Route 15 (SR 15) median south of University Avenue. The pedestrian bridge will allow passengers to access the station's elevators from the street, which will transport them down to the freeway-level transit station platforms. Additionally, crews have been forming transit station walls north of El Cajon Boulevard and preparing for concrete paving of the future transitonly lanes within the existing SR 15 median.

As the safety of motorists and workers is the highest priority, the majority of construction work takes place at night to minimize traffic impacts. Night work also allows construction vehicles to move safely in and out of construction zones. Crews will work to minimize noise and light impacts to the surrounding neighborhoods. O SR 15 Commuter Bikeway Update

Construction crews recently completed the removal of retaining walls in order to create the path for the new bikeway along the east shoulder of northbound State Route 15 (SR 15) between Adams Avenue and Camino Del Rio South. New retaining walls are being constructed along the bikeway alignment, which feature a smooth surface on the lower portion to increase safety and comfort for people riding bikes. The upper portion of the retaining walls will be constructed with a textured finish to match other structures along this part of SR 15.

Because of the future bikeway's proximity to the edge of the freeway, it is necessary to close the northbound on-ramp at Adams Avenue and the northbound off-ramp at Camino Del Rio South to complete the work. These closures are expected to occur Sunday through Thursday from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. throughout the duration of construction. During this time, the ramps will be closed intermittently overnight.

Project Summary

The \$65 million project will build San Diego's first freeway-level transit stations along SR 15 at El Cajon Boulevard and University Avenue. New 2.5-mile transit-only lanes also will be constructed within the existing SR 15 median from just north of Interstate 805 to just south of Interstate 8. The SR 15 Mid-City Centerline *Rapid* Transit Stations Project is expected to be completed in 2017.
