Overnight Lane and Ramp Closures Scheduled March 28–31 on State Route 15

Lane and ramp closures are scheduled on State Route 15 (SR 15) Monday, March 28 through Thursday, March 31. These closures are required to perform construction work as part of the SR 15 Mid-City Centerline Rapid Transit Stations Project and the SR 15 Commuter Bikeway Project.

MTS

- March 28-30: The northbound on-ramps at University Avenue and Adams Avenue, and the northbound off-ramps at El Cajon Boulevard and Camino Del Rio South will be closed Monday through Wednesday from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. each night. Two northbound and two southbound lanes also will be closed during this time.
- March 31: The northbound on-ramp at University Avenue, the northbound off-ramp at El Cajon Boulevard, three northbound and two southbound lanes will be closed on Thursday from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Motorists attempting to access northbound SR 15 from University Avenue or Adams Avenue are encouraged to use El Cajon Boulevard as an alternative to access the freeway.

Nearby residents can expect intermittent lights and noise during construction hours. Crews will work to minimize impacts to nearby businesses, residents, and commuters. Construction schedules are subject to change due to weather conditions.

As the safety of motorists and workers is the highest priority, the majority of construction work takes place at night to minimize traffic impacts. Night work also allows construction vehicles to move safely in and out of construction zones. We appreciate your patience during construction.

Project Summaries

SR 15 Mid-City Centerline Rapid Transit Stations: The \$65 million project will build San Diego's first freeway-level transit stations along SR 15 at El Cajon Boulevard and University Avenue. New 2.5-mile transit-only lanes also will be constructed within the existing SR 15 median from just north of Interstate 805 to just south of Interstate 8. The SR 15 Mid-City Centerline Rapid Transit Stations Project is expected to be completed in 2017.



SR 15 Commuter Bikeway: The SR 15 Commuter Bikeway will provide a safe and direct bike route connecting communities in the Mid-City area of the City of San Diego with the major retail, commercial, education, and entertainment destinations in the city's Mission Valley area. The bikeway, which will be separated from vehicle traffic, will extend from Adams Avenue along a one-mile segment of northbound SR 15 to Camino Del Rio South. The SR 15 Commuter Bikeway is expected to open in 2017.
