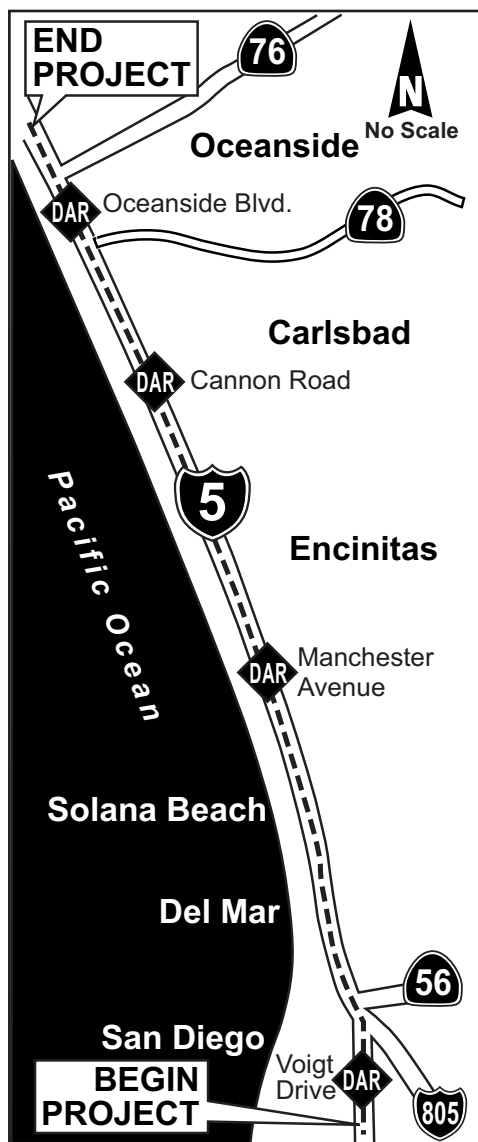




# Notice of Public Comment Period Extended to November 22, 2010

## Interstate 5 North Coast Corridor Project Draft Environmental Impact Report / Environmental Impact Statement



SAN DIEGO –The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is seeking the public's input on the Draft Environmental Impact Report/ Environmental Impact Statement (EIR/EIS) prepared for the Interstate 5 North Coast Corridor Project.

Caltrans and the Federal Highway Administration have agreed to extend the public comment period to November 22, 2010 to give resource agencies, and residents who live along the corridor, more time to provide their comments, because of the large volume of information analyzing a 27-mile long project area that crosses six lagoons, six cities, all within the California "Coastal Zone."
