



I-5/SR 56 Interchange Project Public Meeting

June 13th, 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. – Del Mar Hills Academy

On June 13th, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will host a public meeting on the Interstate 5 (I-5)/State Route 56 (SR 56) Interchange Project at Del Mar Hills Academy, located at 14085 Mango Drive in Del Mar. The meeting will run from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. and will allow community members an opportunity to provide feedback and ask project team members questions about the project.

The meeting is an important part of the 45-day comment period which began on May 18th when the Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR)/ Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the I-5/SR 56 Interchange Project was released for public review.

The Draft EIR/EIS is a direct result of more than 10 years of community, private and public collaboration. Five alternatives (four build and one no build) are included in the Draft EIR/EIS, which analyzes environmental, air quality, visual and other community impacts. The alternatives have been developed to be sensitive to the community and environment, while addressing regional connectivity and local congestion.
