
Keep San Diego Moving

Mira Mesa Boulevard/Sorrento Valley Road Ramp Closures at Interstate 805 Interchange

Beginning Friday, May 18 at 9 p.m. through Monday, May 21 at 5 a.m., the Interstate 805 (I-805) southbound off-ramp and on-ramps at Mira Mesa Boulevard/Sorrento Valley Road will be closed. Additionally, Sorrento Valley Road will be closed from the I-805 bridge to approximately 1,000 feet west of the freeway. Construction crews will be preparing the area for the next phase of the I-805/HOV Carroll Canyon Road Extension Project. Scheduled to open to traffic in the spring of 2013, the project adds approximately two miles of new High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV), or carpool lanes, in each direction along Interstate 805 (I-805) from Interstate 5 to Carroll Canyon Road, offering new transportation choices for travelers.

Motorists are advised to avoid the area, if possible. However, those with work identification cards from Scripps Business Services and Websense will be escorted through the closure. Detour signs will be posted to help motorists access alternative routes throughout construction.

On Monday, May 21, all left turn pockets and left turns from business driveways on Sorrento Valley Road from the I-805 southbound on-ramps to approximately 1,000 feet west will be removed. The existing Sorrento Valley Access Road also will be closed and moved west 300 feet.

The painted left turn pockets will be replaced with two sets of double yellow lines. Additionally, temporary bridge supports will be constructed under the Mira Mesa Boulevard/Sorrento Valley Road undercrossing to facilitate the widening of that structure.
