Project Objectives

Goal: To enhance rail services and provide an attractive alternative to solo driving in the busy I-5 corridor and to:

- Ensure train service runs on time
- Improve transit and freight rail capacity
- Increase the level of train service to provide for future demand
- Eliminate significant rail system bottlenecks along the coastal rail corridor












Double Track Overview

- Constructs a one-mile stretch of double track within existing railroad right-of-way
- Results in a ten-mile segment of continuous double track to eliminate rail system bottlenecks and idling trains
- Adds two track crossovers to allow trains to cross from one track to the other between Surfrider Way and Pier View Way as they approach or leave Oceanside Transit Center














Future Double Track Alignment













Bridge Replacement Overview

- Replaces the aging single-track bridge, which was built in 1929 and rehabilitated in 1970, with a double-track bridge
- Includes a modern, concrete bridge design
- Will be built east of the existing bridge within the railroad right-of-way
- Maintains service during bridge construction
















San Luis Rey River Rail Bridge

San Luis Rey River Trail Undercrossing Improvements

SANDAG is collaborating with the City of Oceanside to:

- Improve public access to the pedestrian and bicycle undercrossing
- Realign the undercrossing for enhanced public safety and visibility
- Raise the elevation of the trail and add a drainage system to help reduce flooding impacts












San Luis Rey River Trail Undercrossing Improvements







North Oceanside Double Track Project Informational Public Meeting

October 9, 2013

Thank you for joining us to learn more about the North Oceanside Double Track Project!

Tonight's informational public meeting will offer members of the public the opportunity to learn more about the future rail improvement project and to ask project team members questions. The meeting is an open house format, so please visit each topic station for detailed project information.

The North Oceanside Double Track Project is funded through preliminary engineering and environmental review only and is not yet funded for construction. The planned improvements include the replacement of the aging single-track San Luis Rey River rail bridge with a modern double-track bridge and the construction of a one-mile stretch of second main track.

Additionally, the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) is collaborating with the City of Oceanside to:

- Improve the bike and pedestrian undercrossing on the south side of the San Luis Rey River rail bridge,
- Redesign the car and pedestrian undercrossing adjacent to Oceanside Harbor, and
- Construct street median improvements at Surfrider Way to support a future Quiet Zone in Oceanside that would limit train horn noise.

The project is one part of a comprehensive package of highway, rail and transit, and coastal access improvements planned for the Interstate 5 North Coast Corridor, which spans 27 miles and includes six coastal cities of Oceanside, Carlsbad, Encinitas, Solana Beach, Del Mar, and a part of San Diego.


