Overnight & Weekend Rail Bridge Work Scheduled for January

Crews will be working around the clock over the next three weekends as construction nears completion on four rail bridges in the Los Peñasquitos Lagoon. The work will

include removing an old bridge, setting girders, pouring concrete foundations, and removing temporary dirt fill. Nearby residents and businesses can expect some intermittent day and nighttime noise and lights from construction activities, SANDAG and North County Transit District (NCTD) will work to minimize noise and other impacts to nearby residents and businesses during construction. About the Project


SANDAG is working in collaboration with NCTD to replace the four aging, wooden trestle railway bridges in the Los Peñasquitos Lagoon with modern concrete bridges. The lagoon bridges were built between the 1910s and 1930s. The new single-track bridges will help meet current and future demand for intercity, commuter, and freight rail services. Construction began in late 2015 and is expected to be complete this spring.

HOURS: 24 hours a day beginning Saturday morning at 12:30 a.m. to Monday morning at 3:00 a.m. Work schedules are subject to change due to weather.

During the above weekends, rail service will be temporarily suspended between Oceanside and San Diego along the Los Angeles-San Diego-San Luis Obispo (LOSSAN) coastal rail corridor due to planned Absolute Work Windows (AWWs). AWWs are select weekends that allow for crews to meet significant construction milestones and work unimpeded while all rail services are halted. No passenger or freight trains will run through the corridor between early Saturday morning
