

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New Construction Method to Lessen Noise for Surrounding Residents

Piles, or columns, will need to be installed as the support structure for the bridges. To help lessen noise, a quieter method of constructing piles, called Cast-in-Steel-Shell (CISS), will be used. The installation of pre-drilled CISS piles will help reduce construction noise for residents who live near the lagoon.

Protection of the Lagoon and Sensitive Habitat

SANDAG is committed to ensuring native habitats are protected, preserved, restored, and/or enhanced during rail improvement projects. This project, as well as other transportation enhancements in our coastal habitats and lagoons, is planned in collaboration with lagoon foundations, and state and federal environmental resource agencies.

Throughout the project, SANDAG will monitor construction to ensure the native habitat and wildlife are protected.
