# Los Peñasquitos Lagoon Bridges **Replacement Project**

### **Daytime and Intermittent Night Work Planned for Rail Bridge Replacements**

Residents can expect intermittent noise from construction activities through October as crews replace aging rail bridges in the Los Peñasquitos Lagoon. A temporary structure being constructed adjacent to the northernmost bridge will be used to stage/move machinery and materials needed to build the new rail bridge. To secure the structure's foundation, construction crews will drive temporary steel beams underground. The work will occur from approximately 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.

#### **Additional Night Work Planned Through October**

Through October, there will also be intermittent night work near the rail bridges as needed until this phase of the project is complete. Work includes transporting materials and equipment, installing special fencing to help protect the lagoon, and stabilizing the area around the existing bridges to prepare for construction.

Federal regulations require train conductors to sound the horn when approaching and passing through an active construction site, even in a quiet zone. Work schedules are subject to change without notice. The contractor will take all reasonable steps to minimize noise and other impacts to nearby residents and businesses. We appreciate your patience during construction.

#### **About the Project**

SANDAG is working in collaboration with the North County Transit District (NCTD) to replace the four aging, wooden trestle railway bridges in the Los Peñasquitos Lagoon with modern concrete bridges. The lagoon bridges were built between the 1910s and 1930s and have aged beyond the average operating life of 75 years. The new single-track bridges will help meet current/ future demand for intercity, commuter, and freight rail services. Construction began in August 2015 and is expected to last approximately two years.
