Soil Testing Work Planned May 2015 in Solana Beach and Del Mar

SANDAG will conduct soil testing next month along the railroad tracks in Solana Beach and Del Mar in advance of a future double track project. Activities will include drilling in 22 locations within the railroad right-of-way.

Work Schedule

Fri. May 1 - Fri. May 29, 2015

Hours: 7:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m.

Intermittent Night Work: Fri. May 1 - Mon. May 4

Some work will be done overnight from May 1 – May 4, during an Absolute Work Window (AWW). AWWs are select weekends when all rail traffic is halted to accommodate construction improvements without interruption; no trains will operate in the corridor from late Friday evening through early Monday morning. North County Transit District (NCTD) and Amtrak will post information regarding alternate travel options for this weekend.

Crews will minimize noise and other impacts to nearby residents and businesses to the greatest extent possible. Thank you for your patience.

About The Project

The San Dieguito Double Track and Special Events Platform Project will replace the nearly 100-year-old wooden trestle San Dieguito Railway River Bridge, construct two miles of double track from Solana Beach to Del Mar, and build a special events platform at the Del Mar Fairgrounds for NCTD COASTER and Amtrak Pacific Surfliner trains.

The environmental review process began in 2013 and is anticipated to continue through 2015. Although not funded through construction, this project is expected to be completed by 2030.

About LOSSAN

SANDAG is working in collaboration with NCTD to construct approximately \$1 billion in improvements in the San Diego segment of the LOSSAN (Los Angeles-San Diego-San Luis Obispo) rail corridor over the next 20 years, including a primary effort to double track the corridor from Orange County to Downtown San Diego. Double tracking allows trains traveling in opposite directions to pass without slowing down or stopping. The rail enhancements are part of a package of transportation, environmental, and coastal access improvements within the North Coast Corridor.
