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Overnight Lane and Ramp Closures Scheduled September 11-15 on SR 15



Overnight lane and ramp closures are scheduled along State Route 15 (SR 15) beginning Sunday, September 11, through Thursday, September 15. The closures are needed to accommodate storm drain work as part of the SR 15 Mid-City Centerline *Rapid* Transit Stations Project.

The following closures will be in place on SR 15 between Interstate 8 (I-8) and Interstate 805 (I-805) from 7 p.m. until 5 a.m.

- Northbound SR 15 to eastbound and westbound I-8 connector ramps
- Northbound off-ramp at Camino Del Rio South
- Northbound on- and off-ramps at Adams Avenue
- · Southbound on-ramp at University Avenue
- Two southbound and two northbound lanes on SR 15 between I-8 and I-805

At least two lanes will remain open along SR 15 at all times. Travelers are urged to allow extra time to reach their destination or consider using alternate routes. The closures may affect San Diego Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) routes. Please visit <u>sdmts.com</u> for detour information.

During construction, nearby residents can expect intermittent lights and noise during the evening and into the early morning. Crews will work to minimize impacts to nearby businesses, residents, and commuters. Construction schedules are subject to change.

As the safety of motorists and workers is the highest priority, the majority of construction work takes place at night to minimize traffic impacts. Night work also allows construction vehicles to move safely in and out of construction zones. We appreciate your patience during construction.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The \$65 million project will build San Diego's first freeway-level transit stations along SR 15 at El Cajon Boulevard and University Avenue. New 2.5-mile transit-only lanes also will be constructed within the existing SR 15 median from just north of Interstate 805 to just south of Interstate 8. The SR 15 Mid-City Centerline *Rapid* Transit Stations Project is expected to be completed in summer 2017.
