Upcoming Construction Activities for the Mid-Coast Trolley Project

Impacts to Noell Street

Starting Sunday, May 13, Mid-Coast Trolley crews will be conducting nighttime work on underground communication systems within the railroad right of way at Noell Street, in lower Mission Hills, near the intersection of Kurtz Street, just a block northeast of Pacific Highway. Work will last for approximately one month.

What to Expect

- Only one direction of traffic will be closed at a time.
- Work hours and lane closures will be in effect Sunday through Thursday, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Detour routes and signage will be in place. Please heed all traffic signs and use caution when traveling near the work area.
- Residents and businesses may notice the presence of crews, work lights, demolition noise, and vehicle safety back-up alarms during construction.
- Crews will minimize impacts as much as possible.

Construction schedules may change with very little notice.

About the Project

The Mid-Coast Trolley project will extend Trolley service from Old Town Transit Center to the University City community, serving major activity centers such as Mission Beach, the VA Medical Center, UC San Diego, and Westfield UTC. Nine new stations will be constructed. Major construction work began in 2016, with service anticipated to begin in 2021.
