



Upcoming Construction Activities for the Mid-Coast Trolley Project

Impacts to Palm Street, Sassafras Street and Olive Street

Through summer 2019, Mid-Coast Trolley crews will continue intermittent nighttime work on underground communication and electrical systems within the railroad right of way at Palm Street and Sassafras Street. As part of this work, crews will also be installing a new traction power substation at Olive Street, near the railroad right of way, starting Monday, September 24 through approximately summer 2019.

What to Expect

Palm Street and Sassafras Street

- Construction activities will include trenching, excavating, and installing signal foundations, electrical wire and devices.
- Lane closures will be required for this work. One direction of traffic will be closed at a time, and detour routes and signage will be in place. Please heed all traffic signs and use caution when traveling near the work area.
- Work will be intermittent through summer 2019. General work hours are Sundays through Thursdays, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. Some day and weekend work may also be required.

Olive Street

- Construction activities will include demolition of the existing substation, grading, and installation of power services and the traction power substation that powers the Trolley.
- Work will be intermittent through summer 2019. General work hours are Mondays through Fridays, 6:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Some night and weekend work may also be required.
- Residents and businesses may notice the presence of crews, work lights, demolition noise, and vehicle safety back-up alarms during construction.
- Crews will minimize impacts as much as possible.

Construction schedules may change with very little notice.

About the Project

The Mid-Coast Trolley project will extend Blue Line Trolley service from Old Town Transit Center to the University City community, serving major activity centers such as Mission Bay, the VA Medical Center, UC San Diego, and Westfield UTC. Nine new stations will be constructed. Major construction work began in 2016, with service anticipated to begin in 2021.
