Overnight & Weekend Rail Bridge Work Scheduled This Weekend

Crews will be working around the clock this weekend as construction continues on four rail bridges in the Los Peñasquitos Lagoon. This weekend's work will concentrate

on the northernmost bridge, where crews will be working on the bridge foundation, and at the southernmost bridge, where crews are working to complete the bridge structure. Nearby residents and businesses can expect day and nighttime noise and lights from these construction activities. SANDAG and North County Transit District (NCTD) will work to minimize noise and other impacts to nearby residents and businesses during construction. Thank you for your patience.



About the Project

SANDAG is working in collaboration with NCTD to replace the four aging, wooden trestle railway bridges in the Los Peñasquitos Lagoon with modern concrete bridges. The lagoon bridges were built between the 1910s and 1930s. The new single-track bridges will help meet current and future demand for intercity, commuter, and freight rail services. Construction began in late 2015 and is expected to be complete mid-2017.











AWW Construction Work Schedule

Saturday, March 25 - Monday, March 27

HOURS: 24 hours a day beginning Saturday morning at 12:30 a.m. to Monday morning at 3:00 a.m. Work schedules are subject to change.

From Saturday, March 25, to Sunday, March 26, rail service will be temporarily suspended between Oceanside and San Diego along the Los Angeles-San Diego-San Luis Obispo (LOSSAN) coastal rail corridor due to planned Absolute Work Windows (AWWs). AWWs are select weekends that allow for crews to meet significant construction milestones and work unimpeded while all rail services are halted. No passenger or freight trains will run through the corridor between early Saturday morning and early Monday morning. Regular passenger rail service is scheduled to resume in time for the morning commute on Monday. Riders are encouraged to allow for more time, as trains could be delayed in arriving at their final destination.
