

Build NCC Construction Scheduled to Begin Next Week

Build NCC rail improvements, which include replacing the San Elijo Lagoon rail bridge and double tracking, will begin next week as crews remove vegetation and install temporary construction fencing in select areas near the rail line between Cardiff-by-the-Sea and Solana Beach. Work will take place Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. with night work as needed.

Residents and businesses near the rail line can expect to see construction equipment and vehicles moving in and out of the project area.

Upon project completion, crews will replace removed vegetation with non-invasive landscape native to the region's coastal zone. The new landscape will be irrigated with 100 percent recycled water, which will be turned off once the vegetation has been established.

About the San Elijo Lagoon Double Track Project

The San Elijo Lagoon Double Track Project is a \$75.7 million project that will add 1.5 miles of new double track from Cardiffby-the-Sea to the southern border of the San Elijo Lagoon, replace the wooden trestle bridge over the San Elijo Lagoon with a modern concrete bridge, construct a new pedestrian undercrossing at the south end of the lagoon, and improve the signal and grade crossing at Chesterfield Drive.















About Build NCC

Build NCC is the first phase of the North Coast Corridor (NCC) Program in the cities of Solana Beach, Encinitas, and Carlsbad. Build NCC includes extending the existing carpool lanes on I-5 in each direction from Lomas Santa Fe Drive to State Route 78, double tracking the rail line from Cardiff-by-the-Sea to Solana Beach, replacing the highway and rail bridges at the San Elijo and Batiquitos lagoons, restoring the San Elijo Lagoon, and constructing nearly 10 miles of new bike and pedestrian trails. Construction on the first phase is expected to be completed by 2021.
