In February, the SANDAG Board of Directors heard a summary of the agency's recent public outreach efforts about a potential funding measure. People across the region were invited to share their priorities for future transportation and infrastructure projects – from expanded transit services and more bike lanes to adding carpool lanes, and conserving more land for open space. Public input is critical as the Board considers a potential funding measure for the November ballot. This video highlights input received during this outreach effort - which included surveys, telephone town hall meetings, public meetings, emails, and voice mails - and was used to draft expenditure plan alternatives. A refined alternative will be discussed at two meetings scheduled in March: SANDAG Board of Directors Retreat, 10 a.m., Thursday, March 10 and the SANDAG Board of Directors Meeting, 9 a.m. Friday, March 25.

Construction will begin in earnest this month on South Bay Rapid, a 21-mile route between the Otay Mesa Port of Entry along the U.S.-Mexico border and Downtown San Diego. A groundbreaking ceremony for the \$113 million project was held Feb. 17. A construction open house will be held at Otay Ranch High School Monday, March 7, 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Project team members will be available to answer questions and provide information about the project, including traffic detours, closures, and the construction schedule. South Bay Rapid will provide travelers with a frequent and reliable transit choice, connecting key housing and job centers in San Diego County. The service, which is expected to begin in 2018, will be operated by San Diego Metropolitan Transit System.

# Fallbrook Area Park & Ride Lot Temporarily Closed



The Park & Ride lot at State Route 76 (SR 76) and Old Highway 395 in the Fallbrook area will be closed through June 30 so crews can work on expanding and improving the facility. Parking is available at the temporary lot located south of SR 76 and east of Old Highway 395. During the closure, improvements that will be made include: bike lockers, sidewalks, new traffic signal at Via Altamira and Old Highway 395, improved drainage, and additional parking spaces. The Park & Ride expansion is part of the SR 76 East Segment Project, funded in part by the regional TransNet half-cent sales tax for transportation.
