



Beginning the week of April 2, crews will start removing the temporary sound blanket that was placed between the guideway bridge construction and the Monet and Treviana properties.

Removal of the entire sound blanket is expected to take approximately three to four weeks. Crews will begin removing the sound blanket on the north side of the guideway bridge, beginning at State Route 125 and work their way west towards Magdalena Avenue. Crews will then switch to the south side of the guideway bridge and work their way west to east. This work will take place on weekdays between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m.



The sound blanket removal marks a major project milestone. This will help reduce the overall work area and restore street parking along Impressionist Drive. While guideway bridge construction is substantially complete, the sound blanket restricted access and the ability for crews to work under the bridge on landscape improvements and wall aesthetic features. After the sound blanket is removed, crews will place a six-foot fence with screening to visually shield the remaining work and to secure the construction area. The work under the bridge is anticipated to take approximately eight weeks after the removal of the sound blanket.

All reasonable steps will be taken to minimize impacts to nearby residents. The entire South Bay Rapid project team greatly appreciates the community's patience throughout construction of the transit guideway bridge. Schedule subject to change due to weather conditions.
