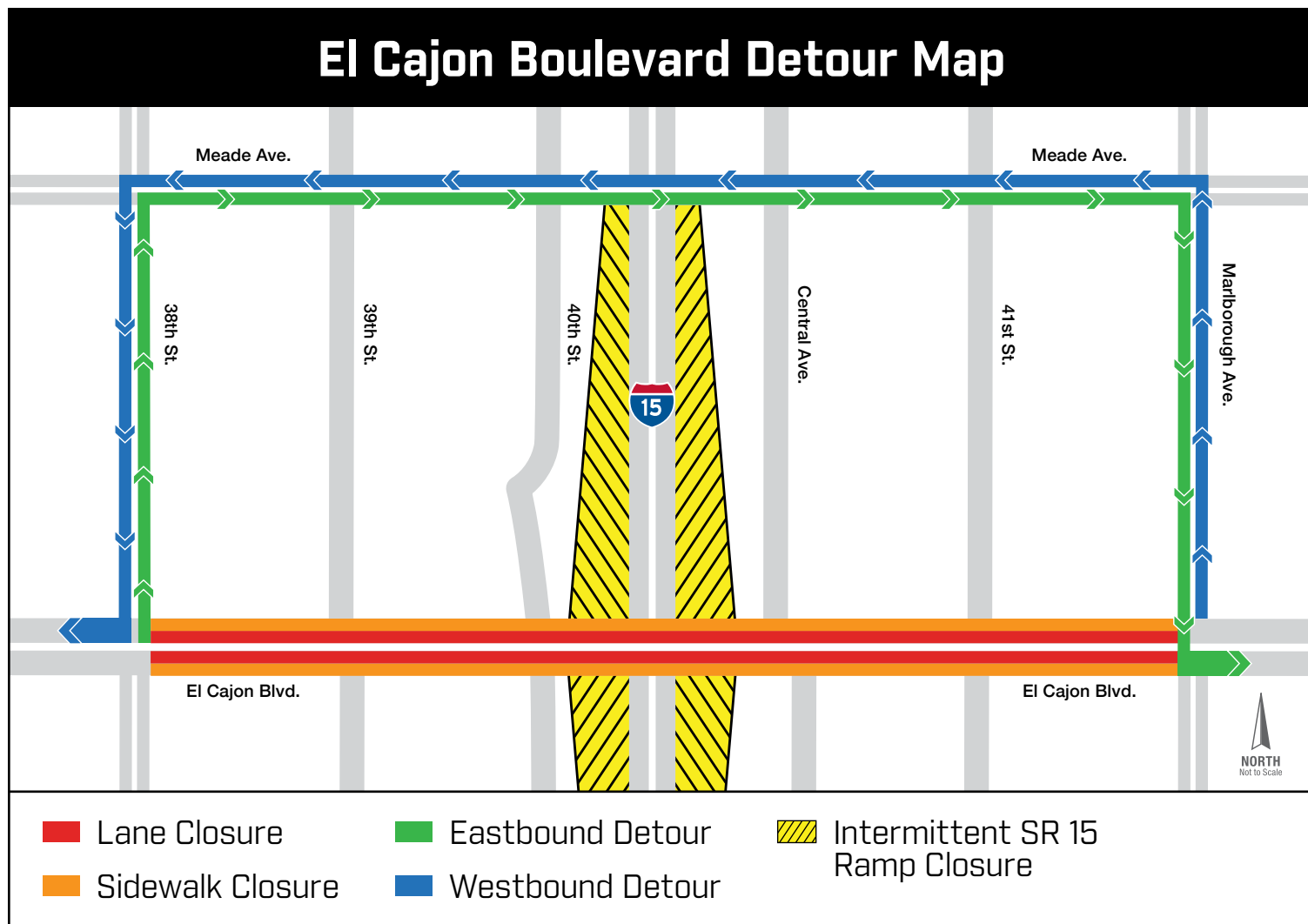

Construction Update: Closures on El Cajon Boulevard at SR 15 Scheduled to Begin December 12

Crews will install new traffic signals along El Cajon Boulevard beginning Monday, December 12 and continuing through Thursday, December 15. Work will take place each night between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m.

During this time, lane and sidewalk closures will be in place in both directions along El Cajon Boulevard between 38th Street and Marlborough Avenue. The northbound and southbound SR 15 on- and off-ramps at El Cajon Boulevard also will be closed intermittently during the aforementioned work hours. Detour signs will be in place directing the traveling public around the closures (see the detour map below).



Travelers are urged to allow extra time to reach their destination or consider using alternate routes. The closures will affect San Diego Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) routes. Please visit sdmts.com for bus schedules.

During construction, nearby residents can expect intermittent lights and noise during the evening and into the early morning. Crews will work to minimize impacts to nearby businesses, residents, and commuters. Construction schedules are subject to change.

As the safety of motorists and workers is the highest priority, the majority of construction work takes place at night to minimize traffic impacts. Night work also allows construction vehicles to move safely in and out of construction zones. We appreciate your patience during construction.

Daytime Ramp Closure Scheduled December 14

The northbound SR 15 off-ramp at El Cajon Boulevard will be closed on Wednesday, December 14 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. for paving work. Detour signs will be in place and motorists traveling north on SR 15 can exit at University Avenue.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The \$65 million project will build San Diego's first freeway-level transit stations along SR 15 at El Cajon Boulevard and University Avenue. New 2.5-mile transit-only lanes also will be constructed within the existing SR 15 median from just north of Interstate 805 to just south of Interstate 8. The SR 15 Mid-City Centerline *Rapid* Transit Stations Project is expected to be completed in summer 2017.
