## Traction Power Substations Installation / Decommissioning

The Trolley Renewal Project team will be conducting work related to the installation of Traction Power Substations, which convert power for trolley operations. Due to the new low-floor trolley cars, the substations are required to provide the correct amount of power. Crews will install and/or decommission existing substations located throughout Blue and Orange Line Trolley stations to ensure the new trolley cars operate smoothly. This work is anticipated to be complete within six to eight months.

### Benefits

- New substations will convert enough power to operate the new low-floor trolley cars.
- Substations will be more energy-efficient.

### Station/Rider/Business Information

- Trolley stations will remain open during installation and/or decommissioning of the substation.
- All work will be conducted between the hours of 7 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Limited Sunday work may occur.
- Some night work may occur between the hours of 10 p.m. and 5 a.m.
- Noise and dust is anticipated during construction.
- Pedestrian and service access to businesses and sidewalks will be maintained during construction.
- The schedule may change with very little notice.



Please use **extra caution** during construction when crossing the tracks.

### The Trolley Renewal Project

The Trolley Renewal Project is a joint project of the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) and the San Diego Metropolitan Transit System (MTS). Once complete, new low-floor Trolleys will operate throughout the system. All stations will be equipped with next-arrival signs, new shelters, and seating. The end result will be easier access, quicker trips, a more comfortable ride, and an enhanced transit experience. This work is part of a \$660 million project to renew the entire MTS Trolley network. Funding for the project was provided by *TransNet*, the regional half-cent sales tax for transportation administered by SANDAG; California Proposition 1A and 1B; and the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.
