Regional Bike Plan & EAP



- Regional Bike Plan
 - Adopted May 2010
 - Extensive outreach
 - Prioritized based on land use, demographic, social, and other factors
- Early Action Program
 - \$200 million in *TransNet* funds,
 supplemented with other funding sources
 - > 70 miles of bikeways

Designing for People of All Ages and Abilities

- Safe movement of people
- Protected bikeways provide separation from cars
- Traffic calming to reduce speeds
- Challenges in urban areas due to limited space and competing uses

Benefits of Bikeways



- Safety
 - Safer travel for all roadway users
- Health
 - Increase in physical activity
 - Lower rates of mental and physical health issues
- Travel
 - Improved access for everyone
- Environment
 - Less air pollution

- Equity
 - Affordable and accessible
 - It costs > \$10K / year to own a car
- Business + economy
 - Converting parking to bikeways results in higher or steady:
 - Sales / revenues
 - Customer counts
 - Visit frequency

Bikeway Program Status



63 OF 70 MILES OPEN OR UNDER DEVELOPMENT









- ~12 mile network

Fourth and Fifth Avenue Bikeways



- 4.5 miles of urban protected and buffered bikeways in the City of San Diego
- ~45% construction complete
- \$18M construction cost
- Open to public in 2022



Parking



- 2016 2017: SANDAG worked with City staff to identify parking changes that:
 - Are physically necessary as part of the project
 - Add additional parking capacity
- 2017 Now: City implementing identified parking conversions on side streets
- 2020 Now: SANDAG installing parking on Fourth and Fifth per plan

FOURTH AND FIFTH AVENUE BIKEWAYS PROJECT

Construction of the SANDAG Fourth and Fifth Avenue Bikeways project is expected to begin in early to mid July 2020 and be completed in 2022. Work will take place along Fourth Avenue and Fifth Avenue between Washington Street and B Street in the City of San Diego. Construction will be phased so that individual blocks will be constructed at different times over the next two years. Specific construction notices for each block will be posted to our website and emailed in advance of starting construction.

Most work will occur Monday through Friday, holidays excluded, between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Occasional Saturday work may be required. We apologize for any inconvenience and appreciate your patience during construction.

Construction schedules are subject to change

The Fourth and Fifth Avenue Bikeways project will add more than 4.5 miles of new bikeways that will make the streets safer and more pleasant for all users. They will provide a vital connection for residents to walk and bike between vibrant communities within San Diego's urban core including Hillcrest, Bankers Hill, and Downtown San Diego.
