
Overnight Closures of Euclid Avenue at Interstate 805 Scheduled

Euclid Avenue at Interstate 805 (I-805) will be closed sporadically overnight during the next two weeks to accommodate work to widen the freeway bridge. Euclid Avenue will be closed between Sweetwater Road and Ridgeway Drive sporadically from March 27 to April 12 between the hours of 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. Motorists are urged to avoid the area or take alternative routes. Motorists will be detoured around Euclid Avenue at I-805 during nighttime closures.

TEMPORARY DETOURS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

Southbound Euclid Avenue Closure at I-805:

Drivers who wish to travel south on Euclid Avenue will be detoured west on East 22nd Street, south on Prospect Street, south on Vista Way/Prospect Street, then east on Sweetwater Road to Euclid Avenue.



Northbound Euclid Avenue Closure at I-805:

Drivers who wish to travel north on Euclid Avenue will be detoured west on Sweetwater Road, north on Prospect Street/Vista Way, north on Prospect Street, east on East 22nd Street, north on Prospect Street, then east on East 20th Street to northbound Euclid Avenue.

Bridge improvements are part of the first phase of the I-805 South Express Lanes Project, a \$1.4 billion effort to create a modern new transportation backbone for South County. Construction on the first phase of the project began in June. Work includes building one carpool lane in each direction along an eight-mile segment of the freeway stretching from East Palomar Street in Chula Vista to State Route 94 in San Diego. The carpool lanes are scheduled to open in fall 2013.

In an effort to reduce congestion during construction, travelers are being encouraged to consider

alternative routes to work and school, especially during peak travel periods. One solution is to take the South Bay Expressway. Use the South Bay Expressway for an easy, stress-free commute to downtown, Sorrento Valley, Santee, Interstate 8 and Interstate 15, Otay Mesa, Mexico and more.

Construction crews will work to minimize impacts to nearby businesses, residents, and commuters. We appreciate your patience during construction. For more information about the project, please visit www.keepsandiegomoving.com/1805South.
