- a. **Application No. 9-20-0268 (State Lands Commission,** Santa Barbara Co.) Application of State Lands Commission to permanently re-abandon 4 leaking legacy oil wells in the subtidal and intertidal zone offshore Summerland, Santa Barbara County. (DG-SF)
- b. Application No. 9-20-0275 (RTI Infrastructure, Inc., San Luis Obispo Co.) Application of RTI Infrastructure, Inc. to construct cable landing station and operate state waters portion of subsea fiber optic cable extending from Grover Beach, San Luis Obispo County, through state and federal waters, and terminating in Singapore, Grover Beach, San Luis Obispo County. 13. FEDERAL CONSISTENCY

- a. CC-0002-20 (RTI Infrastructure, Inc., San Luis Obispo Co.) Consistency Certification by RTI Infrastructure, Inc. to construct and operate federal waters portion of fiber optic cable described above extending from Grover Beach, San Luis Obispo County, through federal waters and terminating in Singapore, Grover Beach, San Luis Obispo County. - b. CC-0001-20 (San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG), San Diego Co.) After-the-fact Consistency Certification by San Diego Association of Governments for Del Mar Bluffs Emergency Repair Project undertaken in November and December 2019 to preserve railroad trackbed support after bluff erosion temporarily halted train operations in November 2019. The submittal also includes updates on planning for future Del Mar Bluffs stabilization projects and the double track tunnel project for relocation of the railroad to an inland alignment. (LS-SF)
