EXPLORATORY GEOTECHNICAL WORK PLANNED IN EARLY MARCH

In early March, SANDAG will be conducting exploratory geotechnical work in several locations within the cities of Del Mar and San Diego to learn about the underground soil structure, as part of the San Diego Regional Rail Corridor Alternative Alignment and Improvements Conceptual Engineering Study (SD-LOSSAN).

The exploratory work is expected to take place weekdays between **March 1 and March 12*** during daytime hours (8:30 a.m. – 4 p.m.). Crews expect to be in each location between 2-3 days. One-way flagging and/or traffic management will be in place on the streets listed below.

- 13600 block of Durango Drive, San Diego
- 12800 block of Portofino Drive, San Diego
- 300 block of Luzon Avenue, Del Mar
- 400 block of Avenida Primavera, Del Mar

**Please note, boring schedules are subject to change.*

The SD-LOSSAN Study is evaluating alternative rail alignments proposed in a previous conceptual alignment study completed by SANDAG and will suggest improvements for the San Diego section of the LOSSAN rail line to address future demand for additional service. Part of the study is to further evaluate alternative strategies to move the tracks completely off the Del Mar Bluffs. Thank you for your patience!



What Residents Can Expect During This Work

- A boring machine (see example on reverse) and other related equipment
- Traffic control and short delays (access will always be maintained to and from individual properties and emergency vehicles)
- Temporary no-parking restrictions
- Short periods of intermittent noise
