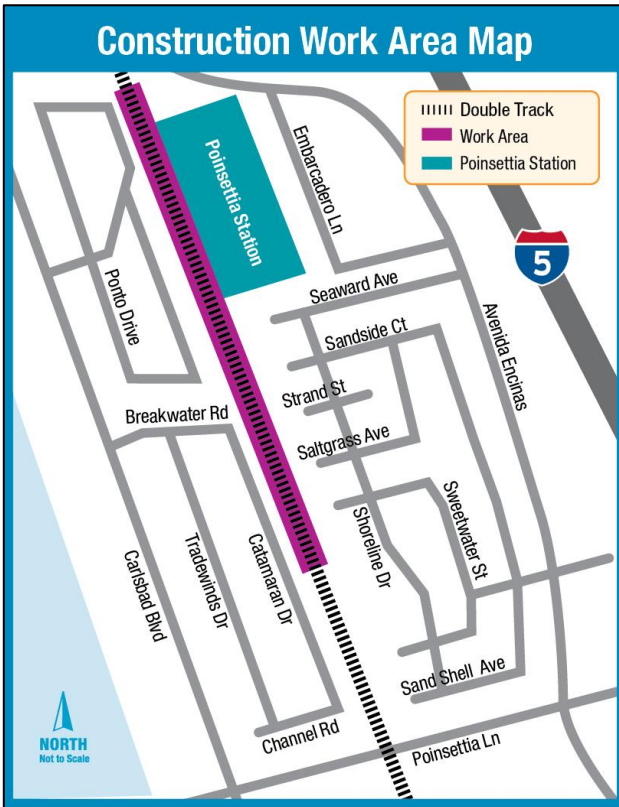


Poinsettia Station Improvements Project Update


Night and Weekend Work at Poinsettia Station: February 1 – February 2



As part of the Poinsettia Station Improvements Project, construction crews will continue work on remaining station improvements during an Absolute Work Window (AWW) taking place **Saturday, February 1, at 12:00 a.m., through Monday, February 3, at 5:00 a.m.**, along the Los Angeles-San Diego-San Luis Obispo (LOSSAN) coastal rail corridor. AWWs are select weekends that provide crews safe access to work unimpeded directly along the rail line while all rail services are halted to meet significant construction milestones.

This weekend, crews will sawcut and install trench drainage infrastructure at the new station undercrossing. Nearby residents can **expect construction noise and lights from this activity**, which include [Occupational Safety and Health Administration \(OSHA\) required vehicle back-up alarms](#). **During this AWW, the station undercrossing will be inaccessible to the general public and pedestrians will be detoured around the construction site.** Residents also can expect to see construction equipment and vehicles moving in and out of the work areas.

Crews will work to minimize noise and other construction-related impacts to surrounding residents. **Please note, construction schedules and activities are subject to change.** Thank you for your patience during construction.



TRAIN HORN RULES

Federal regulations require the train engineer to sound the horn when approaching an active construction site, even in a quiet zone. Train horns serve as a warning system to ensure the safety of railroad workers.
