### WEEKEND CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION

SANDAG and NCTD will be working on the LOSSAN coastal rail line within the railroad right-of-way. Day and night activities may include track work, installing rail turnouts and crossovers, signal testing, and other maintenance activities.

Crews will minimize noise and other impacts to residents and businesses to the greatest extent possible. Because this is an active rail line, engineering and construction must be conducted when trains are not in operation.
