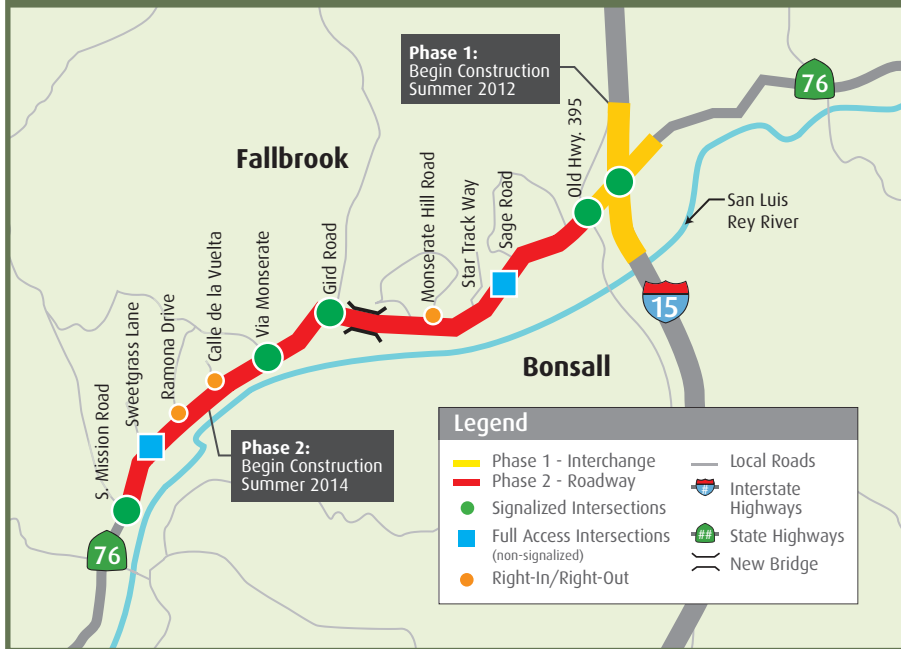


State Route 76 Corridor Frequently Asked Questions Series

Welcome back to your informational series about the State Route 76 (SR 76) Corridor. This series answers frequently asked questions about improvements to travel, safety and the environment along the corridor. This month's question is:

The East Segment Completes the Major Link between I-5 and I-15



Question:

When will construction begin on the East Segment of SR 76, which runs from South Mission Road to just east of I-15?

Answer:

Construction will begin this summer on improvements to State Route 76 (SR 76) East Segment. The project will be constructed in two phases.

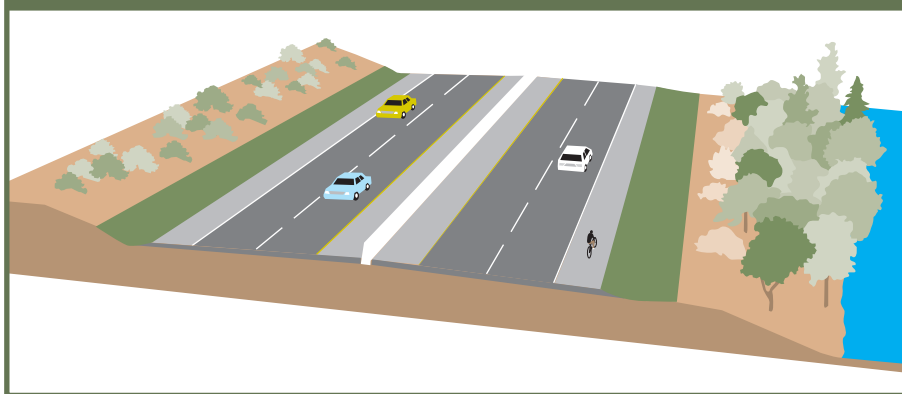
Phase 1 will upgrade the SR 76/I-15 interchange to help traffic flow. This work includes:

- ▶ Widening the existing SR 76 bridge over I-15.
- ▶ Upgrading the on and off-ramps, including the addition of loop on-ramps to I-15 to create a partial cloverleaf configuration.

Phase 2 will follow in Summer 2014 with the widening of the SR 76 from South Mission Road to the improved SR 76/I-15 interchange. This work includes:

- ▶ Providing a four-lane highway that will increase capacity, reduce congestion, and meet present traffic needs and accommodate future growth.
- ▶ Expanding the Park & Ride at Old Highway 395 and SR 76.
- ▶ Creating a barrier-separated median to separate oncoming traffic.
- ▶ Constructing shoulders to serve bicyclists, pedestrians and to provide emergency parking.
- ▶ Constructing animal undercrossings within the corridor and installing fencing to help wildlife move across the corridor.
