Rail Service and Construction Notice

POSTPONED: Night and Weekend Rail Work from January 21 - 23

Please be advised that due to anticipated storms this week, the planned Absolute Work Window (AWW) for Saturday, January 21, to Monday, January 23, has been postponed. Crews are tentatively set to make up this AWW in mid-February. AWWs are select weekends that allow for crews to meet significant construction milestones and work unimpeded while all rail services are halted. Throughout the weekend, there will be regular rail service from Oceanside to Downtown San Diego.

About the LOSSAN Program

Today, the San Diego segment of the LOSSAN (Los Angeles-San Diego-San Luis Obispo) coastal rail line accommodates more than 50 passenger and freight trains each day, moving more than seven million people and \$1 billion in goods annually. As these numbers are projected to grow, SANDAG is working in collaboration with North County Transit District to improve the San Diego segment, including a primary effort to double track the majority of the LOSSAN corridor from Orange County to Downtown San Diego. Double tracking allows trains traveling in opposite directions to pass without slowing down or stopping, increasing the overall efficiency and reliability of the corridor. Other infrastructure improvements along the LOSSAN corridor include bridge and track replacements, new platforms, pedestrian crossings, and other safety and operational enhancements.
