#### Weekend Rail Service Closures Planned This Month

##### Residents Can Expect Nighttime Construction Noise

During three weekends in January, rail service will be temporarily suspended between Oceanside and San Diego along the Los Angeles-San Diego-San Luis Obispo (LOSSAN) coastal rail corridor due to planned Absolute Work Windows (AWWs).

AWWs are select weekends that allow crews to meet significant construction milestones and work unimpeded while all rail services are halted. No passenger or freight trains will run through the corridor between early Saturday morning and early Monday morning. Regular passenger rail service will resume in time for the morning commute on Mondays.

#### AWW Construction Work Schedule

*Weather permitting, subject to change.*

**Dates:** Saturday, January 9 – Monday, January 11  
Saturday, January 16 – Monday, January 18  
Saturday, January 23 – Monday, January 25

**Hours:** 24 hours a day beginning Saturday morning at 12:30 a.m. to Monday morning at 3:00 a.m.

During the January AWWs, workers will continue to install support columns on three of the Los Peñasquitos Lagoon rail bridges. To date, more than 80 percent of the columns have been installed at the northernmost rail bridge and the remaining center columns will be installed by late January.

Federal regulations require train conductors to sound the horn when approaching an active construction site, even in a quiet zone. SANDAG and North County Transit District (NCTD) will work to minimize noise and other impacts to nearby residents and businesses during construction. Thank you for your patience.

### About The Project

SANDAG is working in collaboration with the North County Transit District (NCTD) to replace the four aging, wooden trestle railway bridges in the Los Peñasquitos Lagoon with modern concrete bridges. The lagoon bridges were built between the 1910s and 1930s and have aged beyond the average operating life of 75 years. The new single-track bridges will help meet current and future demand for intercity, commuter, and freight rail services. Construction began in August 2015 and is expected to last approximately two years.
