### RAIL CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

#### **Oceanside Transit Center Platform Improvement Project**

Nearby Residents and Businesses Can Expect Nighttime Noise on Feb. 23, Feb. 25-27, & Mar. 2

Night and weekend work is planned for Thursday, February 23, Saturday, February 25, through Monday, February 27, and March 2, as crews remove the existing crossover between Oceanside Boulevard and Wisconsin Avenue, install a new crossover, and install a remote house and canopy shelters. Crews also will be working near Wisconsin Avenue from 12:30 a.m. on Saturday, February 25, until 3 a.m. on Monday, February 27. During this time, Wisconsin Avenue will be closed to traffic between Cleveland Street and S. Myers Street. No parking will be permitted in this area. Signage will be posted in advance to notify motorists and people on bikes of the closure and detour via Oceanside Boulevard.

Nearby residents and businesses can expect intermittent day and nighttime noise and lights from these construction activities. Crews will work to minimize noise and other impacts to nearby residents and businesses. Thank you for your patience during construction.

#### **Rail Service Suspended from Oceanside to San Diego**

During the weekend of Feb. 25-26, all rail service will be temporarily suspended between Oceanside and San Diego along the Los Angeles-San Diego-San Luis Obispo (LOSSAN) coastal rail corridor for the scheduled Absolute Work Window. Regular passenger rail service will resume in time for the morning commute on Monday.

## TRAIN HORN RULES

Federal regulations require train conductors to sound the horn when approaching an active construction site, even in a quiet zone. Train horns serve as a warning system to ensure the safety of railroad workers. ### About the Project

The project will improve the efficiency and on-time performance of the station's transit operations by adding a third track, which allows for an additional train to move through the station when two trains are boarding passengers. Other project improvements include constructing a new boarding platform to the south, extending an existing platform to the north, adding new crossovers and turnouts to enhance rail operations, and modernizing the station's amenities with new shelters, directional lighting, seating, and electronic signs displaying real-time arrivals and departures. Construction is expected to be complete in late 2017.
