



FULL CLOSURES OF SOUTHBOUND GENESEE AVENUE FOR BUS PAD CONSTRUCTION

Beginning Sunday, August 30, a series of full closures on Genesee Avenue will continue between Executive Drive and La Jolla Village Drive. During the closures, crews will install bus pads for new Metropolitan Transit System bus stops located adjacent to the future Executive Drive Trolley Station. Bus pads are durable surface areas, typically made of concrete, used to protect asphalt roadways at bus stops.

This series of full closures on Genesee Avenue is expected to continue on a weekly basis through September. Closure details will be released as dates are finalized. Traffic controls and detour routes will be posted. Motorists should take alternate routes to avoid potential congestion. Please heed all traffic signs and use caution when traveling near the work area.

What to Expect:

Beginning Sunday, August 30 through Tuesday, September 1, and continuing Tuesday, September 8 through Thursday, September 10:

- Full closure of southbound Genesee Avenue between Executive Drive and La Jolla Village Drive
- Work and closure hours will begin at 6 p.m. on the first day of the scheduled closures and will continue through 2 p.m. on the final day of the closures
- As work progresses, one southbound lane on Genesee Avenue will reopen to vehicles

Construction schedules are subject to change.





















About the Project

The Mid-Coast Trolley project will extend UC San Diego Blue Line Trolley service from the Santa Fe Depot in Downtown San Diego to the University community, serving major activity centers such as Mission Bay, the VA Medical Center, UC San Diego, and University Towne Centre. Nine new stations will be constructed. Major construction work began in 2016, with service anticipated to begin in late 2021.
