



Upcoming Construction Activities for the Mid-Coast Trolley Project

Impacts to Taylor Street

Through summer 2019, Mid-Coast Trolley crews will continue intermittent nighttime work on underground communication and electrical systems within the railroad right of way at Taylor Street.

What to Expect

- Construction activities will include trenching, excavating, and installing signal foundations, electrical wire and devices.
- Lane closures will be required for this work. One direction of traffic will be closed at a time. and detour routes and signage will be in place. Please heed all traffic signs and use caution when traveling near the work area.
- Work will be intermittent through summer 2019. General work hours are Sundays through Thursdays, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- MTS and NCTD are also doing track work in the area and will be closing both directions of traffic on Taylor Street between Pacific Highway and Congress Street over two full weekends scheduled from 9 p.m. Friday, October 12, to 5 a.m. Monday, October 15 and from 9 p.m. Friday, October 19 to 5 a.m. Monday, October 22. Some additional weekend work may be required.
- Residents and businesses may notice the presence of crews, work lights. demolition noise, and vehicle safety back-up alarms during construction.
- Crews will minimize impacts as much as possible.

Construction schedules may change with very little notice. Check KeepSanDiegoMoving.com/MidCoast for regular schedule updates.

The Mid-Coast Trolley project will extend Trolley service from Old Town Transit Center to the University City community, serving major activity centers such as Mission Bay, the VA Medical Center, UC San Diego, and Westfield UTC. Nine new stations will be constructed. Major construction work began in 2016, with service anticipated to begin in 2021.
