Upcoming Construction Activities for the Mid-Coast Trolley Project

Morena Boulevard and Littlefield Street Lane Closures and Parking Impacts

Due to unforeseen conditions related to the age of the existing utility system, sewer line construction at Morena Boulevard and Littlefield Street, originally scheduled for completion at the end of June, will continue through the end of July 2018. The following lane closures and parking impacts will continue to be in effect on Morena Boulevard and Littlefield Street to accommodate the construction:

- A full lane closure of Littlefield Street at Morena Boulevard.
- A single lane closure of northbound and southbound Morena Boulevard, from Ashton Street to Asher Street.
- No parking on southbound Morena Boulevard at Ashton Street and Littlefield Street.

What to Expect

- Work hours and lane closures will be in effect Monday through Friday, 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Access to businesses and homes will be maintained.
- Construction activities will include street excavation and trenching, manhole demolition, sewer pipeline installation and trench resurfacing.
- Detour routes and signage will be in place. Please heed all traffic signs and use caution when traveling near the work area.

This work requires the use of heavy machinery and will generate noise. Crews will minimize impacts as much as possible.

The Mid-Coast Trolley project will extend Trolley service from Old Town Transit Center to the University City community, serving major activity centers such as Mission Bay, the VA Medical Center, UC San Diego, and Westfield UTC. Nine new stations will be constructed. Major construction work began in 2016, with service anticipated to begin in 2021.
