MID-COAST TROLLEY CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

LANE REDUCTIONS AND BUS SERVICE IMPACTS ON EASTBOUND BALBOA AVENUE

Beginning Monday, September 14, lane reductions on eastbound Balboa Avenue will be in place for bus pad improvements related to the Mid-Coast Trolley project. Bus pads are durable surface areas, typically made of concrete, used to protect asphalt roadways at bus stops. Additionally, service will be suspended at the San Diego Metropolitan Transit System (MTS) bus stop located at Balboa Avenue and Moraga Avenue. Through access on eastbound Balboa Avenue and ramp access from Morena Boulevard will be maintained, though traffic flow may be impacted. Please expect delays when traveling in the area.

What to Expect

Beginning Monday, September 14:

- Single lane closure on eastbound Balboa Avenue in place through Monday, September 21, between the northbound Interstate 5 off-ramp to Balboa Avenue and Moraga Avenue
- Closure of MTS bus stop at Balboa Avenue and Moraga Avenue in effect for approximately two weeks
- Please heed all traffic signs and use caution when traveling near the work area

Construction schedules are subject to change.

About the Project

The Mid-Coast Trolley project will extend UC San Diego Blue Line Trolley service from the Santa Fe Depot in Downtown San Diego to the University community, serving major activity centers such as Mission Bay, the VA Medical Center, UC San Diego, and University Towne Centre. Nine new stations will be constructed. Major construction work began in 2016, with service anticipated to begin in late 2021.
