RAMP CLOSURE ON SOUTHBOUND MORENA BOULEVARD

Beginning Tuesday, June 1 and continuing for two weeks, crews will rebuild Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) ramps and sidewalks on Morena Boulevard and Balboa Avenue to provide access to the future Balboa Avenue Transit Center. This work requires a full closure of the southbound Morena Boulevard ramp to westbound Balboa Avenue.

What to Expect

- Work and closure hours will be 24 hours a day for approximately two weeks
- Detour routes and signage will be in place; please heed all traffic signs and use caution when traveling near the work area

Construction schedules are subject to change.

About the Project

The Mid-Coast Trolley project will extend UC San Diego Blue Line Trolley service from the Santa Fe Depot in Downtown San Diego to the University community, serving major activity centers such as Mission Bay, the VA Medical Center, UC San Diego, and University Towne Centre. Nine new stations will be constructed. Major construction work began in 2016, with service anticipated to begin in late 2021.
