MID-COAST TROLLEY CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

ONGOING LANE CLOSURES ON PACIFIC HIGHWAY, TAYLOR STREET, AND ROSECRANS STREET FOR TRANSIT IMPROVEMENTS

Beginning Monday, July 27, the ongoing transit improvement activities along Pacific Highway will expand to include construction at the Old Town Transit Center.

This work is part of the effort to reconfigure Pacific Highway and Taylor Street in preparation for the anticipated increase in Trolley crossings at Taylor Street upon completion of the Mid-Coast Trolley project. Additional improvements are planned for the Old Town Transit Center and the adjacent Park & Ride.

What to Expect

- Activities will include saw cutting, removing planter boxes, roadway excavation, drainage improvements, grading, paving, curb and gutter formation, sidewalk placement, and underground electrical utilities work
- Daytime work hours will be from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., and nighttime work hours will be from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Intermittent lane closures and sidewalk closures will be in place through summer 2021, however through traffic will be maintained
- Please use caution when traveling in the area and follow signage

Construction schedules may change with very little notice.

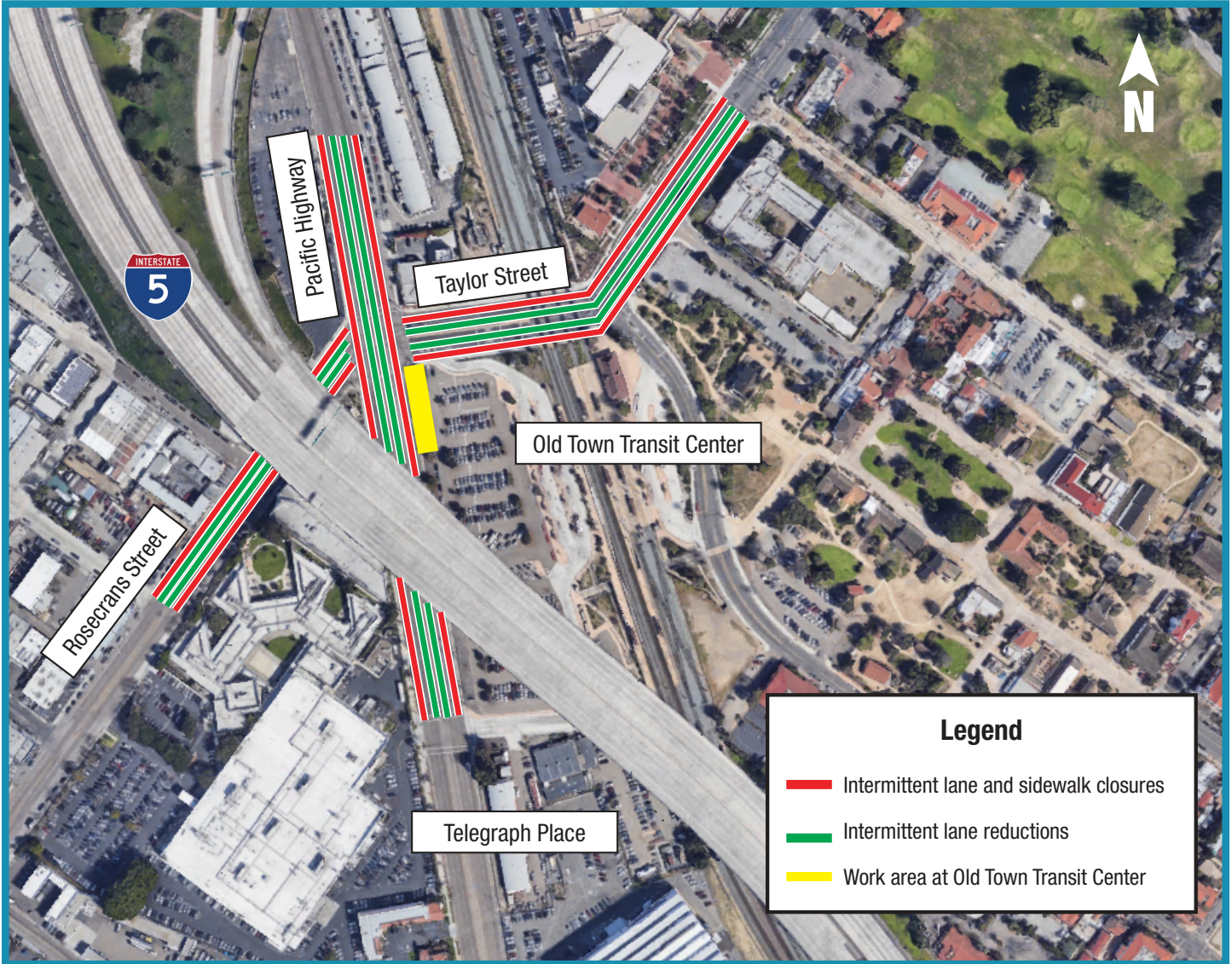

About the Project

The Mid-Coast Trolley project will extend UC San Diego Blue Line Trolley service from the Santa Fe Depot in Downtown San Diego to the University community, serving major activity centers such as Mission Bay, the VA Medical Center, UC San Diego, and University Towne Centre. Nine new stations will be constructed. Major construction work began in 2016, with service anticipated to begin in late 2021.
