



FULL CLOSURE OF NORTHBOUND CAMPUS POINT DRIVE

Beginning June 1, 2020, a full closure of northbound Campus Point Drive will go into effect for crews to realign the roadway for the Voigt Drive Improvements project. At this time, an end date for the closure has not been determined.

This is the second phase in a multi-phased construction effort. The first phase of the project—a full closure of Voigt Drive remains in effect. The Voigt Drive Improvements project is expected to be completed in late 2021.

What to Expect

- The northbound lanes of Campus Point Drive will be closed from Medical Center Drive to Genesee Avenue
- Southbound access on Campus Point Drive will remain open throughout the remainder of the project and a traffic shift will be in place
- Pedestrian access will be closed on northbound and southbound Campus Point Drive
- A three-way stop will be in effect at the intersection of Campus Point Drive and Voigt Drive, which may cause traffic delays
- Southbound Campus Point Drive may be reduced to one inbound lane from Genesee Avenue intermittently during nighttime work hours or on weekends
- Full closures will continue to be in effect on Voigt Drive between parking lot P701 and Campus Point Drive (only inbound access to Scripps Health facilities will be maintained)
- Typical work hours will be Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., though occasional nighttime and weekend work may be required
- Additional traffic control measures will be in place such as temporary traffic signals, temporary wayfinding and detour signage, adjustments to street striping, and roadway and sidewalk reconfigurations

About the Voigt Drive Improvements Project

A joint effort of SANDAG, Caltrans, and UC San Diego, the Voigt Drive Improvements project will realign Voigt Drive and Campus Point Drive to help accommodate existing and future traffic demand in the area. To complete the realignments, crews will widen Voigt Drive, make improvements to the Preuss School parking lot, and conduct utility improvements.

Upon completion, the project will provide direct access to and from the future Voigt Drive Trolley station, improving transit access to the medical facilities in the area.

Update on Construction During COVID-19 Pandemic



About the Mid-Coast Trolley Project

The Mid-Coast Trolley project will extend UC San Diego Blue Line Trolley service from the Santa Fe Depot in Downtown San Diego to the University community, serving major activity centers such as Mission Bay, the VA Medical Center, UC San Diego, and University Towne Centre. Nine new stations will be constructed. Major construction work began in 2016, with service anticipated to begin in late 2021.
