OVERNIGHT CLOSURES OF I-5 FROM THE I-805 MERGE TO LA JOLLA VILLAGE DRIVE

GILMAN DRIVE BRIDGE PROJECT

Overnight Closures of I-5

To prepare for upcoming bridge infrastructure construction, a series of closures of Interstate 5 will be required.

During these closures, all northbound or all southbound lanes of Interstate 5, between the Interstate 805 merge to La Jolla Village Drive, will be temporarily closed overnight to prepare for placement of falsework (temporary structures used to support the Gilman Drive Bridge until final construction is completed). Motorists should plan to take alternate routes to avoid potential congestion, as significant delays are expected during these closures.

Schedules are subject to change due to unexpected delays.

Major construction and closures are planned on Interstate 5 over the next several months. Please check ShiftSanDiego.com for the latest updates. We appreciate your patience while we complete this regional transportation project.

About the Project

Work on the Gilman Drive Bridge began in late 2016 on I-5 near Gilman Drive. Crews have installed temporary barricades near Gilman Drive that will remain for approximately two years. The new bridge proposes to connect the east and west campus of UC San Diego between Gilman Drive and Medical Center Drive, while spanning over Interstate 5.

Detours

Northbound motorists will be detoured via Interstate 8, State Route 52 and the La Jolla Village Drive ramps. Southbound motorists will be detoured via Interstate 805. Traffic controls and detour signs will be placed to alert motorists in advance.
