Ongoing Intermittent Overnight Closures Planned at I-5/Genesee Avenue Interchange from June 7 through June 12

Closures

Beginning Sunday, June 7, and throughout the week, the Interstate 5 (I-5)/Genesee Avenue northbound off-ramp will be closed intermittently from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. for construction. During this same period, there will be lane closures on I-5 and Genesee Avenue.

Construction schedules are subject to change due to weather conditions.

Progress

In response to comments from motorists, crews recently made modifications to the I-5/Genesee Avenue southbound off-ramp to help improve traffic flow at the interchange during construction. Modifications included lane restriping and signal adjustments. Overnight work also will continue during the week to make surface repairs on the northbound lanes of I-5.

Motorists will soon see the installation of falsework, which are temporary structures used to support the foundation of the new I-5/Genesee Avenue Bridge. Motorists should exercise caution and slow down during construction to help maintain safe travel conditions at the interchange.

About the Project

The \$105 million project will replace the existing six-lane Genesee Avenue overcrossing with a ten-lane structure that will include additional vehicle lanes, sidewalks, and bicycle lanes to better accommodate current and future traffic demands in the San Diego region.
