



The list below shows planned closures and detours as part of highway, rail, bike, pedestrian and lagoon improvement projects. Detour signs will be placed, as needed, to assist motorists through closures. Please note, these closures are subject to change.

Week of May 20

HIGHWAY

- **Sunday, May 20:** Westbound Manchester Avenue will be closed at Interstate 5 (I-5) Sunday night from 9 p.m. - 5 a.m. to allow crews to continue work to relocate utilities.
 - During this closure, motorists on westbound Manchester Avenue will be detoured around the closure using the freeway. No freeway ramps will be closed. Detour signs also will be placed on the freeway notifying motorists of the surface street closure below.
- Motorists should expect narrowed lanes along Devonshire Drive between Melba Road and Requeza Street from Monday, May 21, through Friday, May 25, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. as crews construct a privacy wall.
 - Nearby residents can expect intermittent noise and lights, and flagging operations during construction hours.
- Motorists should expect intermittent ramp closures, lane closures, and reduced lane widths along Encinitas Boulevard and Santa Fe Drive at Interstate 5 (I-5) from Sunday, May 20, through Thursday, May 24, from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. for crews to work on retaining walls under the freeway.

RAIL

- Residents near San Elijo Avenue, just north of the San Elijo Lagoon in Cardiff-by-the-Sea, can expect intermittent daytime construction noise and traffic delays from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday, May 21, through Friday, May 25, as crews install new railroad track.

LAGOON/BIKE/PEDESTRIAN

- Residents and businesses may experience intermittent traffic delays along San Elijo Avenue between Chesterfield Avenue and Santa Fe Drive from Monday, May 21, through Friday, May 25, from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. to allow for Coastal Rail Trail crews to install construction equipment.
- Residents, businesses, and visitors may experience increased activity and noise along Cardiff State Beach in the City of Encinitas and Fletcher Cove Beach in the City of Solana Beach due to on-going beach sand replenishment activities.
