Full Closure of Eastbound SR-905 from La Media Road to Siempre Viva Road Begins Monday Night

SAN DIEGO—Caltrans and SANDAG construction crews will close eastbound State Route 905 (SR-905) between La Media Road and Siempre Viva Road Monday through Wednesday from 8 p.m. to 4 a.m. to build temporary overhead wooden bridge support structures, or falsework.

Motorists may access the Otay Mesa Port of Entry by way of eastbound State Route 11 (SR-11). Detour signs will direct motorists to turn right onto Enrico Fermi Drive, continue south towards Siempre Viva Road, turn right and travel west on Siempre Viva Road until reaching the southbound SR-905 on-ramp.
