






TYPICAL SECTION WITH PARKING





















1- HARBOR DRIVE NORTH OF CHOLLAS CREEK - PARKING OPTIONS










HARBOR DRIVE NEAR RAILROAD CROSSING






ACCOMMODATING OVERSIZE CARGO AT CESAR CHAVEZ PARKWAY

There is no raised median on Harbor Blvd at Cesar Chavez in order to accommodate the movement of oversize cargo out of the Port.






