What is the Rose Creek Bikeway Project?

The Rose Creek Bikeway Project is part of the planned Coastal Rail Trail - a 40-mile system of multi-use paths extending from the City of Oceanside to Santa Fe Depot in Downtown San Diego. The project will improve an important connection between points to the north, such as Sorrento Valley, University City, and UC San Diego, and points to the south, such as Mission Bay, Pacific Beach, Mission Valley, and Downtown San Diego.

Based on input received at the first workshop, the Rose Creek Bikeway is proposed as a combination of a bike path, separate from motor vehicle traffic, and an on-street bike facility. The project will connect existing sections of the Rose Canyon and Rose Creek bike paths in the City of San Diego, filling an approximately two-mile gap in the regional bicycle network. The goal is to provide a comfortable bike-riding environment for people of all ages and abilities.

The project area begins at the north end of Santa Fe Street and connects to the existing bike path at Damon Street and Mission Bay Drive, near the Mike Gotch Memorial Bridge over Rose Inlet.
