Schedule

Late August through October 2012

Benefits

- Street and Curb upgrades as part of the Trolley Renewal Project will make it easier, safer and more convenient for all area commuters in the area.
- New Yellow/White Flex Curb Striping to allow for Commercial Loading and 3-minute Passenger boarding.*
- Extended sidewalks to allow for the new Low-floor Trolleys and for the convenience of pedestrians, bicyclists and businesses.
- Additional 15-Minute Parking on 6th Avenue.

Station/Rider/Business Information

- Late August through October 2012
- The work will include adjustments to sidewalks, curbs, parking spots and lane configurations on 5th and 6th Avenues adjacent to the 5th Avenue Trolley Station between Broadway and B Street.
- This work will take place adjacent to many local businesses from 7 a.m. - 4 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Noise and dust is anticipated during construction. Access for pedestrians and local businesses will be maintained at all times.
- Temporary lane closures on 5th and 6th Avenues are expected.
 Look for signs detailing and temporary detours.



The Trolley Renewal Project

The Trolley Renewal Program is a joint project with the San Diego Association of Governments and the San Diego Metropolitan Transit System. This work is part of a \$720 million project to renew the entire MTS Trolley network. Once complete, new low-floor Trolleys will operate throughout the system. Beginning in September, the Green Line will be extended through Old Town to downtown and terminate at 12th & Imperial via bayside stations (Seaport Village, Convention Center and Gaslamp Quarter). Also beginning in September, the Orange Line will travel from El Cajon to Santa Fe Depot and the Blue Line will travel from San Ysidro to America Plaza. All stations will be equipped with next-arrival signs, new shelters and seating. The end result will be easier access, quicker trips, a more comfortable ride, and an enhanced transit experience.

5th/6th Avenue Improvements

As part of the Trolley Renewal construction on the Downtown Trolley Stations, street and curb improvements are planned for 5th & 6th Avenues beginning late August through October 2012. These improvements include curb popouts at Trolley crossings, adjustments to sidewalks, curb utilization (curb striping) and lane configurations on 5th & 6th Avenues. These improvements will result in much improved access for pedestrians and bicyclists and better configured roadways for drivers on 5th and 6th Avenues.
